Flexible & Multidisciplinary Undergraduate Degrees (Four-Year Undergraduate Programme – FYUP)	Expands student choice, enables broad learning, and reduces rigid academic tracks.	A large-scale example of modular, flexible degree structures.
Academic Bank of Credits (ABC)	Allows credit storage, accumulation, transfer, and pause-and-resume learning across institutions.	A national digital model for credit portability and lifelong learning.

Teacher Professional Standards (National Professional Standards for Teachers – NPST)	Establishes national teacher competencies, expectations, and growth pathways.	A reference model for unified national teacher quality frameworks.
Integrated 4-Year B.Ed. (Bachelor of Education)	Produces better-prepared teachers with subject depth and modern pedagogy.	Evidence supporting integrated teacher education pathways.
Classroom Pedagogy Transformation	Improves foundational learning, inclusion, and classroom engagement.	Practical insights for multilingual and competency-based pedagogy.
